MONETA donated over CZK 32 million to charitable causes last year

During 2023, MONETA Group donated CZK 32.4 million to philanthropic activities. The largest part, 18.3 million, was distributed through the MONETA Clementia Foundation, while the bank donated almost 8 million more to its charity partners and non-profit organisations. MONETA made material donations worth CZK 3.7 million through the MON Help project.

The bank has long been committed to philanthropy for the long and has set a commitment to donate at least 1.5% of its annual net profit to philanthropic causes every year by 2026 at the latest. The bank will publish its results for the recently completed year 2023 on 2 February.

Last year, MONETA, through its Clementia Foundation, waived more than CZK 10.6 million to a total of 34 families who found themselves in a tragic life situation and were no longer able to meet their financial obligations to the bank. *"Clementia assists minor children to whom liabilities in the form of a loan, mortgage or commercial credit are transferred as part of the inheritance proceedings of their deceased parents. We also aid victims of crimes and unintentional traffic accidents with subsequent permanent health damage or people affected by natural disasters or war,"* said Stanislava Hejnová, chairwoman of the Board of the MONETA Clementia Foundation and ombudsman of the MONETA Group.

The Foundation also helped a total of 120 children from children's homes or socially vulnerable families, to whom it donated more than CZK 1.4 million in scholarship programmes and one-off aid.

In two rounds of the grant programme, MONETA also distributed a total of CZK 7.3 million to 75 non-profit organisations, of which CZK 6.2 million was channelled through the MONETA Clementia Foundation, under which the entire programme was transferred last autumn. The bank has been awarding grants since 2016 and has donated a total of CZK 26.9 million to those in need.

Another pillar of the bank's philanthropic activities is the MON HELP project, which was established in 2021 and provides material donations to socially disadvantaged families,

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children, seniors, or single parents. Last year, MONETA donated a total of 20 pieces of computer equipment and approximately 64 pieces of furniture worth CZK 3.7 million.

It then donated over 7.9 million to its long-term partners, whether in the field of supporting the disabled, supporting civil society or protecting the environment. The financial support went, for example, to the Post Bellum organisation and its Memory of the Nation project, the non-profit organisation Women for Women, the charity collection Kuře - Help for Children, and the Czech University of Agriculture's Chytrá Krajina (Smart Landscape) project.

MONETA also supports charitable activities among its employees, for whom it doubled all the collections they had organised. In total, MONETA donated an additional CZK 1.2 million from its social and matching fund.

In 2023, MONETA was the founder of the Pride Business Forum Foundation, whose mission is to promote fair treatment of sexual minorities. For the second year in a row, the bank has continued its partnership with Women for Women, an organisation that has made a name for itself in the country with its Obědy pro děti (Lunches for Kids) project. As part of this cooperation, MONETA is a partner of the Housing for Children project, which helps single mothers pay housing deposits.

For four years MONETA has also been the main bank supporter of the Foundation for the Development of Civil Society (NROS), which runs the largest charity collection in the Czech Republic – Sběrka pro kuře.

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
